Whew, what a year! Some of the words I'd choose to describe how we, as a **TEAM**, persevered through this challenging year are; **flexibility, strength, community, caring and generosity**. We are incredibly grateful to our Board of Directors, individual supporters, private foundations and government grantors for standing firmly beside us and offering flexibility with funds while we navigated the daily, weekly, monthly hurdles during the pandemic.

I must also mention our highly committed in-country expat and local staff who were the **glue that held us together on the ground**; keeping us informed so we were able to step in and address the difficulties our youth and their families in Rwanda and Cambodia faced; **lack of food and clean water, gender based violence in the home and mis-information being conveyed on COVID-19**.

But because of these obstacles, we were also presented with unique opportunities that strengthened our presence by; 1) showing our communities we were still there for them especially during these difficult times which allowed us to better connect and build trust, 2) pivoting when programs were closed down to provide Kids Play families with- food, soap, masks, COVID-19 education and tools to create a less stressed home environment, and 3) increasing parent "buy in" and appreciation for bringing back our programs when allowed in smaller groups with COVID-19 safety protocols. Parents shared the real positive change they see in their children's behaviors from participating in our program- both in school and at home.

I hope our year in review will leave you inspired by seeing how YOUR generous contributions- big and small- deeply impacts our much less resourced youth, families and communities in Rwanda and Cambodia.

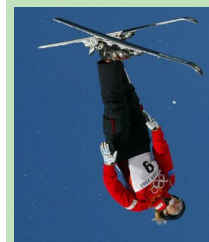
We are looking forward to an exceptional 2021 as we continue to cultivate meaningful relationships and collaborations that will help to create even more equality through sport in our world because.....

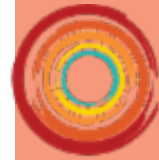
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MISSION AND VISION

Our **vision** is to build a gender equitable global community that empowers girls and develops supportive boys through addressing harmful gender, social and cultural stereotypes.



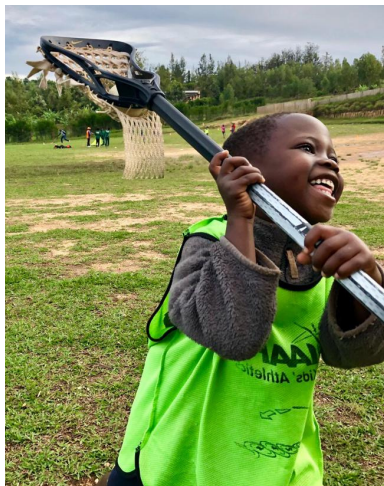

KIDS PLAY CORE PROGRAMS

Let's Play Fair (LPF)

Our foundational mixed-gender weekly after school program for youth ages 7-18 years; using less familiar sports to help girls and boys build better relationships; increase confidence, self esteem, and leadership skills.

All Girls United (AGU)

Serves as an extension of our LPF program, AGU sessions and camps provide girls with additional safe space for leadership and skill-building as they delve deeper into key issues such as sexual and reproductive health, GBV, and negative gender stereotypes.

Play Fair Community Days (PFCD)

PFCD's acts as the bridge for our youth in our LPF and AGU programs to share the lessons learned that week with our wider community. PFCD's bring children and adults together to play lesser-known sports, learn how to apply our Play Fair skills and fosters dialogue around issues of gender equity at home, in school and throughout our community.

LET'S PLAY FAIR

EMPOWERING GIRLS AND CREATING SUPPORTIVE BOYS THROUGH SPORT

Despite the impact of COVID-19, both program sites were able to hold 4 Let's Play Fair (LPF) seasons, including a **COVID-19 Education and Community** season to provide players with a safe environment to discuss their feelings from the stressful lockdown. Our Youth have made great strides in understanding and applying what it means to be a supportive and respectful peer - leading their communities towards gender equality.

Creating Supportive Boys Who can Advocate for Girls

"My sister is part of a women's collective and sometimes asks my parents for money to pay into the collective. When I heard about this I use to automatically ask my parents for money so that it was equal. Now I do not ask for that extra money since I understand the collective helps support and develop women in the community. That is gender equity."

In a sport activity where boys were told they couldn't speak, boys made the connection to how often girls in society are silenced. *"I really wanted to contribute. I had good ideas and was upset that I couldn't share them. Now I understand how girls feel and why it's important to include them."*

IMPROVING GENDER EQUITY ATTITUDES, BEHAVIORS & BELIEFS THROUGH SPORT

Rwanda

Change between 2018-2020

30% fewer players believe that "Boys should always be tough"

25% more players disagree that "Women who wear revealing clothes are asking to be raped."

84% of our players believe that playing sport has improved their ability to communicate with one another.

Cambodia

Change between 2019-2020

20% improvement of players who now believe that "Boys and Girls can be equally good at sports."

32% improvement in players understanding our Play Fair skills

94% of players now understand that our Play Fair skill of Contribution means offering your time, knowledge or skills to help someone else.

THEARA'S STORY

- A Coachs' Belief in a Player-



When Theara first joined the Let's Play Fair (LPF) program, she was extremely shy, lacked confidence, basic social skills and had low school attendance. Her grandmother claimed, *"There is something wrong with Theara's mind and she will never be a good student."*

Kids Play Coach Tien realized that Theara lacked confidence because her family didn't believe in her. Tien made it her mission to give Theara consistent positive reinforcement, provide her with leadership opportunities during program, and check-in weekly with her about school.

After a year in LPF, Theara began to excel as a student and a Kids Play participant, emerging as a prominent leader in our program by confidently answering questions and leading program activities.

Her transformation has not gone unnoticed - during a parent education session, Theara's now very proud grandmother stated,

"Before my granddaughter was very shy but because of KPI, she now is courageous and can use her voice."

2020 PROGRAM IMPACT

ALL GIRLS UNITED -LEADING AND LEARNING-



In 2020 our AGU girls stepped up as leaders, not only learning about the importance of healthy living, gender based violence, menstrual hygiene management, and women's empowerment, but also taking a leadership role by sharing what they learned with LPF boys and their parents.

AGU Girls also took the lead and planned our community-wide Int'l Women's Day events, led activities at LPF and PFCs, and in Rwanda they even helped lead a Parent Education session - sharing what they had learned about Consent.

"It's imperative to know our bodies so that we can make better decisions about our futures"

BRIGITTE'S STORY

-Creating Opportunity through Risk Taking -

Brigitte joined Kids Play Rwanda at 8-years-old, but her self-esteem didn't begin to soar until age 13 when she entered All Girls United (AGU). During AGU sessions, Brigitte has a keen interest in learning about the importance of education and has built her confidence so that now she can contribute meaningful information to the conversation. She's also passionate about sharing information on the importance of menstrual hygiene, as she believes girls must know how to manage their periods safely in order to lead empowered, dignified lives.

Brigitte's tenacity has also transcended into the classroom. Last year, Brigitte took part in Andika Rwanda, a national writing competition and successfully qualified all the way to the District level, representing her school and peers across Southern Province!

"Before Kids Play, I never would have thought I could join this writing competition, as it is mostly boys who apply, but Kids Play gave me the confidence to take a chance... and I did really well!"

Brigitte's determination, eagerness to learn, along with the support from Kids Play coaches has created **Opportunity for her to take positive risks**.....and she's just getting started!

What KPI Has Taught Me

"AGU is helping me learn more about menstrual hygiene and how to take care of myself during my period. I'm also learning leadership skills... I hope to impact my community by sharing this information with other girls, friends and family."

Pivoting during COVID-19 to help provide much needed food to our Kids Play Families

The COVID-19 pandemic continues to impact the most vulnerable, especially children and youth.

In Rwanda, our families were on a strict lockdown for over 3 months--devastating for families who only earn around \$1 a day.

In Cambodia, families are dependent on the now-shuttered tourism sector.

To help KPI families—and prevent children and youth from having to search for food or jobs—Kids Play fundraised to provide food and COVID-19 education for our players and their families.

Delivering Parent Education Sessions

Kids Play used our food distribution to engage, educate and build trust with our parents and our communities. We shared important information around how to make their home a safe space during the pandemic, we discussed healthy communication strategies, the positive effects of implementing gender equality in their homes, and the importance of continuing a girls' education, especially in times of crisis.

"Home becomes safe when you give children time to relax instead of making them work all the time, especially girls, and by being thankful for what they do at home and at school.

I'm working to make sure there's gender equality in my home."

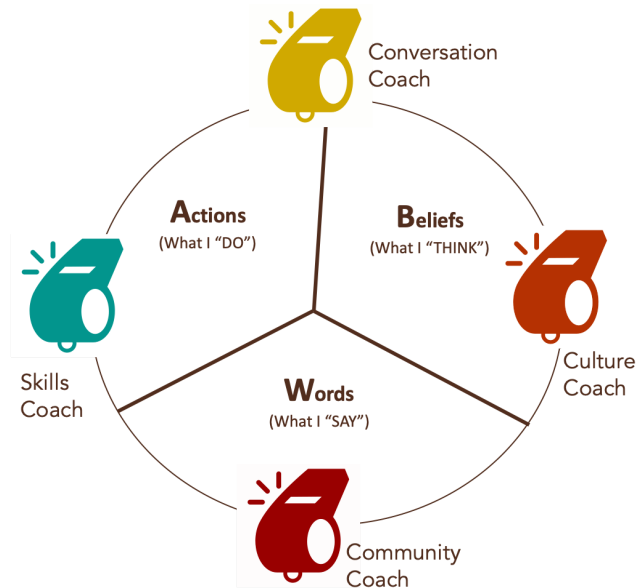

Coaches Step Up During COVID-19

Throughout our Covid-19 Season, **Coaches made an extra effort to connect and check in with players and their families, building trust and showing how to be a caring adult in their lives.** Our coaches ability to take ownership of programs during this time and be leaders in their communities did not go unnoticed.



In a recent focus group discussion with **Cambodian parents**, they expressed a high level of trust in our coaches, even requesting that our coaches meet with non-KPI parents to share what they have learned.

In **Rwanda**, parents pointed out how well our Coaches connected with and continued to educate their kids during this difficult time.

"Sometimes it is harder for children to listen to their parents; I appreciate KPI Coaches because they use the Play Fair skills to teach our kids how to be more respectful and behave safely -- especially during COVID. They have learned a lot."

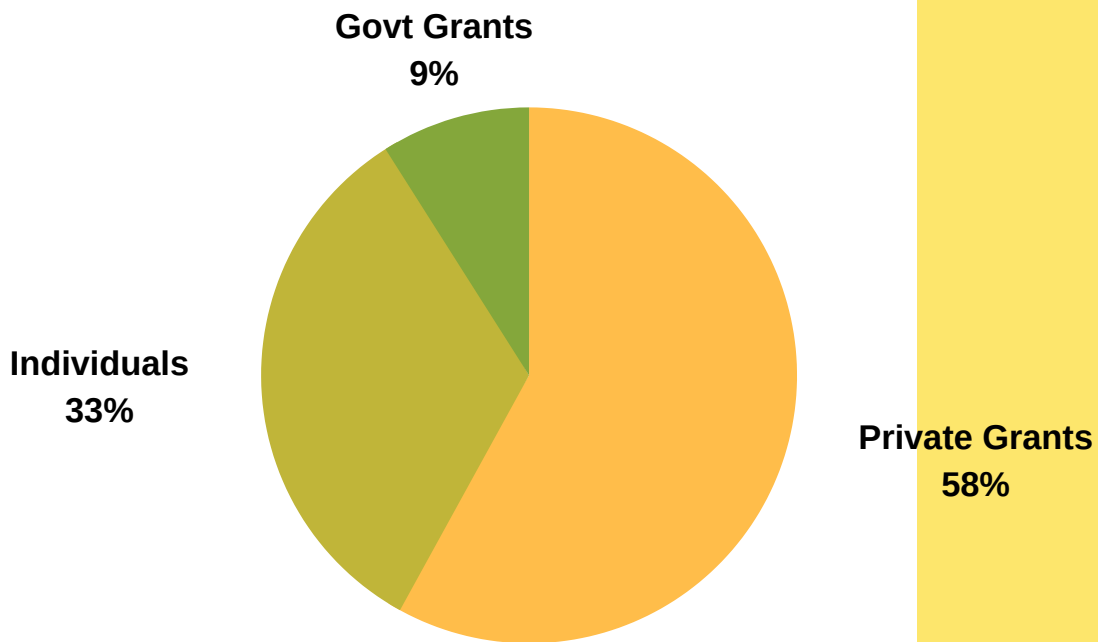

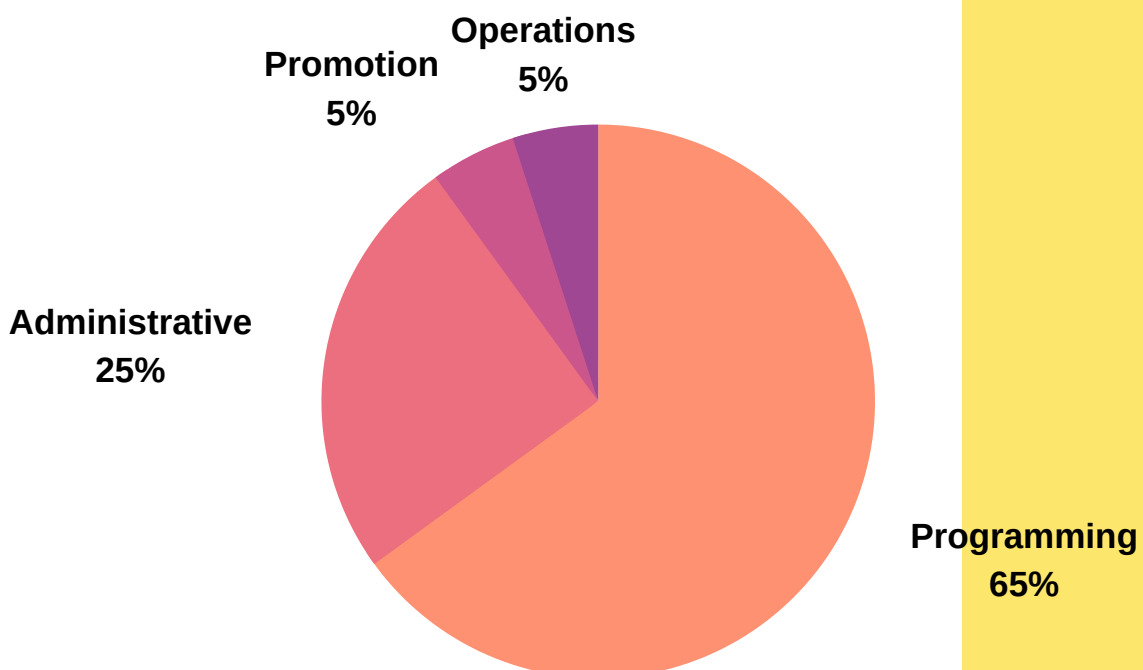
